

Captain Jeremiah Johnson graduated from the University of Wyoming in 2005 with a Bachelor of Arts Social Studies Education and a Minor in Sociology, and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Ordnance Corp.

CPT Johnson First began his military career in 1996 in the Wyoming Army National Guard where he attended Basic Training in Fort Sill Oklahoma, and attended Advanced Individual Training at Fort Sam Houston as a Combat Medic. He transferred to Active Duty in 1998 with his first duty station in Bad Kreuznach, Germany to HHC 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division, where he immediately deployed in support of SFOR in Tuzla Main, Bosnia. He then served as the operations NCO for Charlie Company William Beaumont Army Medical Center, Fort Bliss, Texas. CPT Johnson then applied to the University of Wyoming, and was awarded an Army ROTC Scholarship.

CPT Johnson's first assignment was as the Headquarters and Automotive and Armament Platoon Leader of Bravo Company 101<sup>st</sup> Forward Support Battalion, from October 2005 to March 2006, He was transferred to the newly formed Forward Support Company, 1<sup>st</sup> Engineer Battalion where he served as the Maintenance Control Officer, Maintenance Platoon Leader and Executive Officer from March 2006 to August 2009, where he deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from September 2006 to December 2007. In August 2009, CPT Johnson joined the Kansas National Guard, 287<sup>th</sup> Special Troops Battalion as the Battalion S4 until August 2010 where he was assigned to the 287<sup>th</sup> Support Brigade, Support Operations as the Mortuary Affairs and Air Support Officer. CPT Johnson was transferred to the 108<sup>th</sup> Aviation Battalion in June of 2011 where he deployed as the Battalion S4 to Kuwait. Upon redeployment CPT Johnson returned to Fort Riley in November 2012 to the Warrior Transition Battalion where he completed his training and transition in preparation to assume command of Alpha Company.

CPT Johnson's military education includes Ordnance Officer Basic Course, Combined Logistics Captains Career Course.
